

Can listening to music be bad for you? If you listen to loud music through earphones, you may be doing permanent damage. Don't worry, you don't have to give up your music. There are things you can do to protect your hearing. One thing is to use noise-canceling earphones, which block out background noise so that you can listen to your music at a lower volume. Another suggestion is to limit the time you spend listening to your personal music player. Listening one hour per day at a reasonable volume is safe. Also remember that it's not just loud music through earphones that can damage your ears. Loud concerts, loud music at gyms and nightclubs, and even the noise from car races can damage your ears. If you *are exposed to* loud noises often, buy high-fidelity earplugs, which allow you to protect your ears and hear at the same time. They're available at most music stores. If you take care of your ears now, you'll have less hearing trouble down the road.
