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# Susan's Diary

◇ Saturday, May 28th (10:05 p.m.)

My friend Yuu told me about an interesting article he found online. It said that fish are **considerate** of their wives. There's bad news for men who are going bald: research has confirmed that men who are balding on the *crowns*\* of their heads are at risk of developing heart disease. Researchers studied 22,000 men aged 40 to 84 and found that, compared to non-balding men, men with a completely bald crown had a 36 percent greater risk of having a coronary event; men with moderate crown balding had a 32 percent greater risk; those with mild balding of the top of the head had a 23 percent greater risk; and men with frontal balding had a 9 percent greater risk. They also found that, when compared to non-balding men with the same conditions, men who were balding and had hypertension had nearly twice the risk of heart disease, and those who were balding and had high cholesterol had nearly three times the risk.
